

ASCUTNEY OUTDOORS – Operational Changes for the 2020-2021 Season

Ascutney Outdoors is required to abide by State COVID mandates for your health and safety. We appreciate your understanding and hope that everyone will join us in 'doing the right thing' while enjoying all that Ascutney Outdoors has to offer. Please be advised:

1. Face coverings will be required for everyone. Please do not put our volunteers in the position of having to ask you to wear a mask. They are donating their time so that you may have a wonderful mountain experience, so please abide by the rules.
2. Be sure to practice social distancing.
3. There is a possibility that on some days we will have to limit purchases of day tickets for the T-bar in order to control the length of the lift line. We will however allow Supporter Pass holders to ski on any day we operate.
4. There is no Supporter Pass or Season Pass for tubing. All tickets are purchased on a daily basis at the Tubing Center located at the lower parking lot. It is our hope to accommodate all tubers, but it is possible we will have to limit tickets if the hill or lines become too crowded to ensure COVID protocols are met.
5. All skiers and tubers should think of their car as their "lodge" this season. Use of the AOC will be limited to restrooms. We will have a two fire pits outside, but your vehicle will be your best source of inside comfort this season.
6. There will be no parking up next to the AOC (we will accommodate those who might need assistance). You will be allowed to drive up and drop off, but you will then need to park your car in the lower large parking lot adjacent to the tubing lift. All skippers and back country skiers will also need to use the lower parking lot.
7. Everyone coming to the mountain will be required to provide AO with contact tracing information (name, email, phone) and to attest compliance with Vermont's travel and quarantine policies. Supporter Pass holders will be asked to provide this information just once, at the start of the season. Day Ticket T-bar skiers and tubers will need to provide the information each time they purchase tickets. We encourage daily users to print out and complete the Contact Form before arriving at the ticket line. Backcountry users should sign in and provide contact information.
